Community Gardening

People join community gardens for many different reasons and purposes. Some common reasons include:

- 1. Learning how to grow food
- 2. Teaching others to grow food
- 3. Providing food donations to food programs
- 4. Building & engaging with your community
- 5. Enhancing community safety
- 6. Improving mental and physical health (garden therapy)
- 7. Empowering individuals with resiliency skills
- 8. Enhancing the beauty and functionality of public spaces
- 9. Becoming part of the growing local food movement to enhance food security, food access and food equity
- 10. Contributing to a healthier environment (supporting pollinators, offsetting carbon, etc.)



The Community Gardening Network at **Just Food** is an information and resource-sharing network that supports the sustainable development of community gardening in Ottawa.

Mooney's Bay Community Garden (2020-2022)

729 Ridgewood Ave

- Demonstrated demand for community gardens in the Mooney's Bay area
 - o 100% uptake of 18 garden beds for 3 years
 - Local food banks received fresh produce from dedicated donation beds
- Provided important lessons learned for future community gardens
 - Primary users were from the Norberry Apartments and the Denbury
 - 50% of 2021 gardeners returned in 2022, non-returning gardeners either moved from the area or were too busy
- Given the upcoming construction at Brigil, the beds have been donated to local schools and a daycare



Proposed Paget Park Community Garden (2023)

Hobson Rd.

 Paget Park is the ideal location for a community garden in Riverside Park, given it's <u>access to water</u> and <u>proximity to neighbours without access to</u> green space for gardening


Features:

- 24 raised garden beds planned around the field/rink
- 4 accessible raised garden beds planned along paved pathway
- 3 large water totes that would be filled from existing water access
- Shed to store garden and rink material
- Pollinator patch, compost and bench





Timelines



May 2023 + : If approved, apply to Community Garden Development Fund and start building

March/April 2023: Expecting a Staff Report from the City; after which time will know which community gardens are approved

November 2022: RPCA Garden Committee submitted updated proposal to Just Food based on feedback received from nearby residents

August 2022: Just Food submitted Paget Park Community Garden Proposal to the City

- The City didn't approve any Community Gardens in 2022

2021-2022: RPCA Garden Committee developed Paget Park Community Garden Proposal

RPCA Garden Committee circulated flyers seeking neighbourhood engagement
