Projects:

- Visual Arts
- Performance Art

Artists in residence

Professional Artist from different disciplines will work for a number of weeks with participants in the creation of a big and structured art pieces that will be presented to the general public during the one-day summer Art Festival in Mooney's Bay.

The Riverside Park community participants will benefit from the projects workshops because they will be safe spaces for interaction, individual empowerment and generational and cross culture communication.

The final performance will be free for the Riverside Park community and will bringing neighbourhood development and sense of belonging.

Projects:

- Slam Poetry Music video production (youth project)
- Dance Dance performance (youth and/or adults project)
- Theater Theater performance (youth and/or adults project)
- Visual Art mural or mural installation

Creation process workshops locations:

To be held after school and business hours or on Saturdays during April, May and June.

Possible locations for murals in Riverside Park:

Columns underneath the Via Rail Train tracks at Walkley Rd. Cow Tunnels Norberry Buildings

Possible location for an art installation

Grass triangle at the intersection of Walkley and Riverside

The Riverside Park Arts Festival can start as a one-day festival in Mooney's Bay with access to general public.

A temporary stage can be built for the different performances happening during the evening hours and additionally, short art workshops and art exhibitions can happen during the day.

This option would be the opportunity to local artists to perform in small stages in the case of musicians (soloist or small bands) and showcase and if allowed to sell their creations in the case of artists or artisans.

Vital and relevant artistic / cultural / aesthetic / geographic / language / community influences

Choice of artistic collaborators highly relevant to project
